Ted Steinbock, MD: A native of Louisville, Ted Steinbock, MD is a Harvard trained biologist, anthropologist, and radiologist. His honors thesis, PALEOPATHOLOGICAL DIAGNOSIS AND INTERPRETATION, was awarded the James Tolbert Shipley prize for published research at Harvard and is considered the standard text in the field of paleopathology. Dr. Steinbock combines a busy professional practice in diagnostic radiology with a passionate pursuit of rare books predominantly related to colonial American history, natural history, and science. He is also deeply involved in historic preservation and currently serves on the boards of Shaker Village at Pleasant Hill, Filson Historical Society, and the James Graham Brown Foundation.
